INTRODUCTION

This pioneering Medical College for Women was established in 1992, and was a ground breaking concept at that time. Moreover, it was envisaged to be a first step towards Women Empowerment in both our Health and Socio-economic sector.

Founded by eminent and distinguished citizens of the country, who not only excelled in their chosen field of Healthcare as Doctors and Academics, but also as Social thinkers and Philanthropists, such as, Prof. Dr. AQM Badruddoza Choudhury, Ex. President of Bangladesh (awarded “Independence day award” in 1993), late National Professor Dr. M.R. Khan (awarded “Ekushe Padak” in 2009 and “Independence day award” in 2016), late Prof. Dr. Mujibul Haq and late Prof. Dr. Suraiya Jabeen.

Though, it was originally set up to meet the need of our domestic health sector, its reputation soon attracted applicants from far and near, drawing students from India, Sri Lanka, Afghanistan and Nepal. To address the safety and security concerns of parents of our foreign students, MCWH offers Residential facilities within its own campus.

AIMS

The aims of the medical college for women & hospital is to teach specially selected female candidates for five academic years according to the syllabus laid down by Bangladesh Medical and Dental Council (BMDC) for MBBS degree to be conferred by the University of Dhaka, Bangladesh and then impart training of closely supervised internship for one year to create high quality career doctors for the nation.

OBJECTIVES

1. Introduction to newly designed community oriented medical & dental education including MBBS course.
2. To arrange training course for nurses, paramedical & medical social workers.
3. To provide postgraduate students, training and research leading to certificate of diploma, degree, doctorate and post doctorate degree for strictly limited number.
4. To meet the responsibilities of providing preventive as well as curative health care to the people of Bangladesh and abroad through foreign students.
5. To inspire to develop the essential character qualities, strong sense of righteousness and a basic desire to serve the suffering humanity based on high standard of medical ethics.

5. Location of MCWH in sector-1, Uttara is well placed, safe, surrounded by home of educated professional peoples, good shops, restaurants and groceries where student can get their everyday needs within walking distance.
6. The institute & the student's hostels are within 10 minutes walking distance of the International Airport (nearest than any medical college).
7. MCWH in house hostel accommodation for students. This keeps them safe and secure and they do not require unnecessary travel.
8. Hostel includes Gym, Common Room, Dining Hall, Playground, WiFi etc including some rooms with hot water, Air Conditioner facilities.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Eligibility for admission in MBBS/BDS course in Bangladesh Govt. Medical and private Medical & Dental College is approved by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Medical Education Unit). Bangladesh govt. has formulated the following requirements for admission in MBBS/BDS course in the Govt. & private Medical & Dental colleges.

1. For MBBS course – Eligibility of candidates are as follows:

- a. Students who have passed SSC in 2018 or 2017 and HSC in 2020 or 2019 with GPA 9.00, GPA 3.50 in Biology at HSC level is compulsory for all students.
- b. Students having O level & A level qualifications and foreign students having similar or equivalent qualifications should apply with certificate of equivalence issued from the Director General, Health Directorate, Govt. of the People's Republic of Bangladesh.
- c. Foreign students will have to arrange attestation of their SSC (SSE) & HSC (SSCE) equivalence certificate & mark sheets from their foreign ministry and submit their papers through Bangladesh Embassy in concern countries.
- d. In case of national/foreign students admission will be invalid if any document is found to be discrepancy, before or after admission. No extra foreign/national students will be admitted in excess of the number already specified by the govt. of Bangladesh.

2. Admission will be made on the basis of results of MBBS admission test organized by DGHS, Govt. of Bangladesh. Minimum score requirement for admission is 40.

Admission Process

Application forms along with prospectus will be available from office of the Principal on payment of Taka 1000/- for local students who has undergone through the admission process conducted by the Director, Medical Education, Ministry of Health, Government of Bangladesh and selected for admission in Govt. and Private medical colleges.

PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS: 2020-2021

For Bangladeshi citizen:

- 1) Payment of admission fees and all charges will be made under the Rules of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Peoples Republic of Bangladesh, which will be paid by pay-order in favour of the **“Medical College for Women and Hospital, Uttara, Dhaka-1230”**.
- 2) Yearly tuition fees are payable at the beginning of the year. Failing which they will have to pay 10% surcharge on the amount for default.
- 3) Tuition fees after 1st year to onwards payment will be made by pay order in favour of **“Medical College for Women and Hospital, Uttara, Dhaka-1230”**.
- 4) Re-admission fee Tk. 1,50,000.00 (One lac fifty thousand taka only) plus usual tuition fees of the sessions will be paid by the students (if the student fails to attend her classes and ward for more than six months continuously).
- 5) All students will clear their tuition & other fees so long they continue their regular courses.
- 6) 1st, 2nd, 3rd and final professional examinations are the same rules to apply for students who will fail in examination. If they fail in the final professional MBBS examination, they will have to pay Tk. 25,000.00 (Twenty five thousand taka only) for each attempt for all subjects and Tk. 8,355.00 (eight thousand three hundred fifty five only) for each subject.
- 7) Students who desire to live in hostel, will have to pay minimum 06 (six) month's hostel seat rent in advance at the time of admission and subsequently.
- 8) Students will clear their hostel seat rent before appearing in 1st, 2nd 3rd and final professional MBBS examination under Dhaka University.
- 9) All students shall have to pay any other charges which will be imposed by the concerned authority related to MBBS course, such as RFST, study tour, autopsy visit, etc.

Poor and Meritorious Quota

- 1) 5 (five) free studentship for poor and meritorious students of Bangladesh.
- 2) Such students will not pay any security money like normal students and hence not get remuneration as Internee doctor.
- 3) After completion of 05 years, if the student/students cannot pass the Final Professional MBBS examination, then she will bear the extra tuition fee.

- At the time of admission all students will have to pay minimum six months hostel seat rent in advance, if they choose to live in hostel (first on a first serve basis).
- Students will clear their hostel seat rent before appearing in 1st, 2nd, 3rd and Final professional MBBS examination.
- Once a student who appeared in the final professional examination, If fail she will have to pay USD 267.00 (two hundred sixty seven US dollar) for each attempt per subject.
- All students will clear their pending tuition & other fees as long they continue with their regular courses.
- All students may have to pay additional charges which may be imposed by the concerned authority is related to MBBS course, such as RFST, study tour, autopsy visit, etc.

MEDICAL EDUCATION UNIT

Fundamental of quality of health care is the education and training of the doctors who deliver that care. INSTRUCTION FOR THE STUDENTS

01. Students have to attend classes and ward placement regularly wearing white coloured apron.
02. Students should have all the prescribed books, dissecting instruments, medical equipments of their own classes, demonstration, ward duties, field visit etc.
03. All students must attend their ward schedule and classes in time. If they fail to attend or absent from classes and/or wards, for reasonable cause to be informed to principal office through subject and phase coordinators.
- 04. If any student is absent from classes and/or wards for 03 days or more subsequently, will have to submit an application explaining the cause of absence signed by the student, local guardian & parent to the principal.**
05. Students found absent from classes without prior permission definite cause will have to explain and satisfy the administration, otherwise administrative measures will be taken and parent or guardians will be informed.
06. Absent from classes in group or in mass without prior permission and valid reasons are liable to disciplinary, financial & punitive action. The parents or guardian will be informed.
07. Minimum requirement of class attendance to appear college and university examination is 75%. In this regard no undue consideration will be given by the subject/phase coordinators and administration.
08. After getting MBBS admission, all original academic transcript and certificates (SSC & HSC) will have to submit to the college authority for minimum 02 years. In case of emergency student will get photocopy of the said documents as per procedure.
09. Clinical performance report (3rd year – 5th year) will be maintained as master Log Book.
10. Students must use college library. Books for home issue for short time may be permissible.
11. Students residing in college hostel will have to abide by the Hostel rules and regulations. Any violation of the hostel will make them liable to disciplinary action.
12. Cost of damage or loss to college/Hospital/Hostel property is liable to be realized for students found responsible for the loss or damage.
13. Students are expected to maintain social and religious harmony among themselves.
14. Parents/Guardian will be informed about student's academic records from time to time.
15. Hostel and food charge will bear by the student separately.

Medusa's Staff symbolizes



Asclepius, the Greek god of healing and medicine, carried a **staff** with a snake wrapped around it. This **symbol of** healing **is** called the Rod of Asclepius. Many medical groups use this **symbol** to promote medicine. Others use a **symbol of** a rod with two snakes topped by a pair of wings.

Hippocratic Oath

The **Hippocratic Oath** is an **oath** of ethics historically taken by physicians. In its original form, it requires a new physician to swear, by a number of healing gods, to uphold specific ethical standards.



The oath is the earliest expression of medical ethics in the Western world, encompassing the principles of medical confidentiality and non-maleficence

The Greek physician Hippocrates (460–370 BC)

The OATH

I swear by Apollo Physician, by Asclepius, by Hygieia, by Panacea, and by all the gods and goddesses, making them my witnesses, that I will carry out, according to my ability and judgment, this oath and this indenture.

To hold my teacher in this art equal to my own parents; to make him partner in my livelihood; when he is in need of money to share mine with him; to consider his family as my own brothers, and to teach them this art, if they want to learn it, without fee or indenture; to impart precept, oral instruction, and all other instruction to my own sons, the sons of my teacher, and to indentured pupils who have taken the physician's oath, but to nobody else.

I will use treatment to help the sick according to my ability and judgment, but never with a view to injury and wrong-doing. Neither will I administer a poison to anybody when asked to do so, nor will I suggest such a course. Similarly I will not give to a woman a pessary to cause abortion. But I will keep pure and holy both my life and my art. I will not use the knife, not even, verily, on sufferers from stone, but I will give place to such as are craftsmen therein.

Into whatsoever houses I enter, I will enter to help the sick, and I will abstain from all intentional wrong-doing and harm, especially from abusing the bodies of man or woman, bond or free. And whatsoever I shall see or hear in the course of my profession, as well as outside my profession in my intercourse with men, if it be what should not be published abroad, I will never divulge, holding such things to be holy secrets.

Now, if I carry out this oath, and break it not, may I gain for ever reputation among all men for my life and for my art; but if I break it and forswear myself, may the opposite befall me.

GENEVA DECLARATION (1948)

1. I solemnly pledge myself to consecrate my life to the service of humanity.
2. I will give to my teachers, the respect and gratitude which is their due.
3. I will practice my profession with conscience and dignity.
4. The health of my patient will be my first consideration.
5. I will respect the secrets, which are confided in me.
6. I will maintain by all means in my power, the honour and the noble traditions of the medical profession.
7. My colleagues will be my brothers.
8. I will not permit considerations of religion, nationality, race, party politics or social standing to intervene between my duty and my patient.
9. I will remain the utmost respect for human life from the time of conception.
10. Even under threat I will not use my medical knowledge contrary to the laws of humanity.

I make these promises solemnly, freely and upon my honour.
